About volunteering with SUSU:

The Trustee Board is responsible for the overseeing the work and governance of the Students' Union, and is made up of four of the elected Sabbatical Officers, four elected student trustees, and four external trustees with particular areas of expertise. The Union is a limited company by guarantee that has the status of a charity (a "charitable company"), and the 12 members of Trustee Board are the directors of the company and trustees of the registered charity.

We provide full training at the beginning of the year as well as advice and support as you continue in your role. You will gain a wealth of experience through your voluntary role with SUSU, experience that you can use to improve your future employability while receiving recognition for the work you accomplish.

Main purpose of the role:

- 1) To create and implement the Union's Strategy and related plans.
- 2) To be an active member of the board and the Union.
- 3) To ensure the Union is financially responsible in all areas.

Main responsibilities of the role

To create and implement the Union's Strategy and related plans

- To work in partnership with the other trustees, the Chief Executive, senior staff and students to ensure that the Union has a clear strategic direction, vision and mission that meets the needs of its members.
- To ensure that the Union acts in accordance with its charitable objectives, constitution and other guiding documents

To be an active member of the board and the Union

- To add value to the Board and the Union through generating ideas, and participating fully in Board meetings.
- To act with integrity and avoid or declare any conflict of interest, at times you may handle information that is sensitive and you must keep confidential. As a Trustee, you have a legal responsibility and must respect that.
- To be an active member of the Union in other ways, including taking an interest in the AGM, Union Senate and our elections.

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To ensure the Union is financially responsible in all areas

- To ensure that the Union does not undertake activities that put its financial stability, members or reputation at undue risk.
- To approve annual budgets and large financial expenditure, ensuring it is the most prudent use of funds.
